Peru is predominantly Roman Catholic, at least nominally. Different aspects of native religions have been adapted into their belief system as well.

The two puppets you helped us purchase for our last trip will be traveling with us once again. I'm still debating about traveling with Arnold. 

# Thoughts from Diane . . . "I DO IT MYSELF!"

Every now and then I think about the times my children were young and memories that weren't necessarily positive but made a lasting impression. My oldest son, George II, was a special challenge to raise. He had a stubborn will that at times completely frustrated me. One such time was when I was out with my Mother and toddler son, George II. We needed to cross the street. Naturally, I reached down to take his hand. I was able to get a hold of him and then he pulled his hand out of mine and said, "I do it myself!" I'm not exactly sure what happened then, but I can tell you that he didn't get his own way. As I've looked back on that day, and I've done it many times over the years, that moment was a gateway into the life that was such a challenge to us as parents.



Starting into the New Year, I'm reading through the Bible once again. I spent time doing some study into the life of Cain. God gave Cain some amazing gifts. He had the gift of being first born to the first parents, born into a beautiful new world. He was a gardener and good at what he did. I can only speculate as to what kind of a child he was. I do know that his mother, Eve, realized that, with the help of God, she gave birth to a boy. Adam and Eve must have been filled with wonder and love. Then along came his brother, Abel. Abel was given the work of tending the flocks. Years passed in between their births and the next part of the story. It showed the progression of sin in Cain's life and how tragedy can happen when we allow our sinful nature to control us.

Cain worked the soil and as offering to God, he gave some of the fruit of that labor. It was almost an afterthought. From his best, Abel gave a generous offering. We see a different attitude between brothers. God dealt with those attitudes. God looked "with favor on Abel and his offering," yet on Cain's offering "He did not look with favor." God then addressed Cain's sin when He said "Why are you angry? Why is your face downcast? If you do what is right, will you not be accepted? But if you do not do what is right, sin is crouching at your door, it desires to have you, but you must master it." That verse really struck my own heart. What proceeded to follow was a chosen path to destruction. There was deceit toward his brother and then he murdered him. Next, God asked him a direct question. Cain answered with a lie. Then God addressed the situation and told him of the consequences of his choices. The story goes on, but I sit here and wonder about the grief that Adam and Eve must have endured, not only the loss of Abel but of knowing their son killed his brother. What questions they may have asked themselves. One might have been, "What did we do wrong?" Then there are the "if only I" or also "What did we fail to . . ." I've been there with my own children.

What struck me the most while reading this was to see myself in the sin of Cain's anger, jealousy, lies, arrogance and even more. God has been so gracious to me. First, He led me to His grace. He sent Jesus to die for my sin and accepted me into His family. He has shown me mercy over the years that I cannot even recount if I tried. He continues to reveal Himself to me through His Word and through prayer. He has the same gift of grace that He's given to me,



waiting for you. We will all stand alone before our Creator. We will all give an account. Like Cain, we become arrogant and can say in our hearts, "Not me, I won't be accountable to God." What if you're wrong. John 3:16 "For God so loved the world that He gave . . ." God gave Cain opportunity to repent of his sin. Cain's choice was to ignore God's warning. Please don't make that same mistake. Eternity is a reality. Heaven is a reality. God made it possible through Christ for us to enter His Heaven. We cannot do it on our own.
