# **Thoughts from Diane...** Changes

We've been through so many changes throughout our marriage. Moving (20+ times), different states, different churches, loss. Before I even married, my brother was killed when he was only seventeen years old. That was huge for a fifteen year old brand new Christian. When you have a major event occur like that it changes everything. Mostly it changes the heart and choices of the one who experiences it and is closest to the event. Others cannot understand



the emotion and depth of loss that a person goes through, because God created the people He made as individuals, unique in every way. We can have empathy for those who are our friends and loved ones. We can offer comfort, strength and love as they have a need. Ultimately we can go into God's throne room in dedicated prayer. We can also spend many, many hours getting to know God by faithfully staying in His Word and preparing ourselves for wherever He requires us to serve.

Recently we had a little dog named Chico. I met a woman on my bus route who breeds Shih Tzu's. After that I developed a plan. I wanted to surprise George. I knew who sired the puppy and who the female was. The pregnancy happened and I surprised George when he returned from a mission trip. It was so much fun and I loved Chico before George got to know him. Chico became the first indoor dog we'd had since the kids left home. Over the year and a half God allowed us to have Chico, we became so attached. He was a breeze to teach all the necessities. He was very easy

to love. When he became extremely sick, we, along with our vet, did everything to bring him back to health. That didn't happen. He died. We became overwhelmed with loss, again. We knew the separation was permanent. Jesus died for the lost sinner, not animals. That made it harder to let him go. We suffered a lot of grief. Not like I did when my brother, Bobby, was killed, not like when we had to unplug our son, Ben, from life support but still a difficult loss.



Change happens in everyone's lifetime. Some changes are filled with joy, others with overwhelming sadness. The difference for those who accept Christ in this life is that we have a HOPE ("CONFIDENT ASSURANCE") that no one can take away. When I was young and came so close to death because of serious illness, I became filled with fear. I had no idea what would become of me if I died. God used that fear to lead me to His saving grace. September 12, 1963 was the day that fear ended. I have a HOPE that not only gives me

strength throughout my lifetime but will lead me home to Heaven, eternity with Jesus! There's no greater comfort and peace than to know that someday I'll see Jesus face to face.


