training meetings to serve in Peru the last two weeks of June this coming summer. I will be leading our team, working once again with Steve and Kelley Frerichs and national pastors and their families. The preliminary plans include serving with some of the pastors we have served in previous visits presenting the Gospel, doing cleaning, construction, craft projects and other opportunities the Lord gives us.

This trip, we plan to present the Gospel in a new area, in mountain highland villages a few hours east of Lima. From Steve's report, There are new believers in this area. Steve has is very excited about being able to help reach out to villagers with the goal of planting a healthy New Testament church. This is both an exciting and challenging opportunity.

We also face a tight window to have all our travel plans come together. I will be finishing school bus driving on the 16th and we will probably leave on the 17th. In addition, The Frerichs will be traveling back to the states a few days after we leave.

It appears that since we will have to travel on weekends, the ticket cost will be more than in the past when we were able to book our flights mid-week. We are estimating that each team member will have to raise about \$2,000 in support. We have several hundred dollars already set aside for this trip.

I grew up in a small town in Central Illinois, Chillicothe, and lived in the same house for



eighteen years, we never moved. We have lived in Spokane nearly thirty years. Before moving here in December of 1987, Diane and I had moved twenty-two times in the previous twenty years of marriage. Some of our moves were across town, while others involved cross-country moves. It has been said, "Join the Navy and see the world." It can also be said, "Go into ministry and see the world."

When Diane and I were married in 1969, we moved from our first apartment in Owatonna, MN to a cottage on a state school campus and then after graduation from college we moved to Minneapolis where I attended seminary and served at Plymouth Baptist Church. We thought God would have us serve there for rest of our lives - little did we know. We moved several times while in Minneapolis, from one apartment complex to another where we worked as caretakers while I was in seminary, working a second job and serving at Plymouth Baptist. God redirected, we put our things in storage and then moved to Illinois where we stayed with my parents for a few months, in a mobile home, until God opened the door for us to serve at First Baptist Church in Redondo Beach, CA. The first few weeks, we lived in a motel room until a house opened for us to rent.

Two and a half years later, we moved to Rockford, IL and served there at Windsor Baptist Church. A few years later, we moved to Johnson City, TN and spent a few weeks that summer in dorm rooms on the campus of East Tennessee State University until a temporary house became available. From there we moved to San Francisco, CA where we served at Calvary Baptist Church (we moved three times there) and then here to Spokane, WA (we moved another three times here), serving at Valley 4^{th} Church until God directed us to serve through Eagle Summit in 1996. God gave us the house we are in now and have been here twenty-five years. I look at our first twenty years of ministry as preparation for ministry through Eagle Summit.

I have often considered Abraham and Sarah's adventure when God told Abraham to pack and move. Abraham then relayed God's message to his wife. I'm certain Sarah must have asked, "Where are we going?" I've always been curious as to Sarah's immediate response when Abraham said, "I don't know." Still



Sarah faithfully followed her husband's direction as from God. From a human perspective, she could've said, "You're on your own buddy." Who really was the greater example of faith? How many wives would organize a move to a destination unknown?

During all of our adventures in ministry, Diane has faithfully partnered with me, not merely "following." At God's direction, we have taken STEPS of faith and LEAPS of faith, together. I am so grateful for a devoted and loyal wife who has supported and faithfully partnered with me in ministry. She has been willing to take these leaps of faith alongside me and has been my greatest

We got to know each other those next four months in a way that would have been difficult under other circumstances. God was so gracious to us during that time. It was the best way to begin our love relationship.

There is a song that speaks perfectly to this beginning, here are a few of the words. "Oh rejoice the Lord, He makes no mistakes, He Knows the end of each path that I take . . ." Job 23:10 ". . . He knows where I am going and when He tests me, I will come out as pure as gold."


