We will continue to plan for the future and continue to work to serve the pastors of the small and rural churches. The need is real and the fields are truly "white unto harvest." The opportunities are limitless. You help make it possible for us to do what we are convinced God has directed us to do.

Blessings & Challenges

We are currently \$1,900 behind in our budget with summer approaching. Past history has shown that giving is generally slower during the summer months as well. We also have fewer ministry opportunities scheduled for this summer than ever before. (STOP THE PRESSES . . . I WAS JUST READY TO TAKE THIS NEWSLETTER TO BE PRINTED AND RECEIVED TWO PHONE CALLS RE-QUESTING US TO HELP WITH TWO WEEKS OF CAMP AND A WEEK OF VBS. THIS IS A DIRECT ANSWER TO PRAYER. WE WANT TO SERVE AND BE USED BY GOD.) This convergence of low income and fewer ministry opportunities gives us a reason to pray fervently and continue to seek God's clear direction. We have plenty to do as far as preparation, ministry contacts, writing, web page development and office and resource organization. We do need your continued prayer and financial support to meet needs for the next few months especially. I am tempted in the flesh to say, "Why pray when I can worry," but we continue to trust God to meet needs and direct. Our responsibility is to remain sensitive God's leadership as the directs and redirects.

We are doing our best to be good stewards of the resources God loans us through you. We are still looking for a ministry replacement van, but until God makes the financial picture clearer, our search will be on a back burner. With increased fuel costs, we've been using our personal vehicle whenever possible to save on expenses.

We have canceled our office phone service to save another expense. It is actually more practical to just use our cell phone for ministry contacts. With other responsibilities, I am not able to be at the office on a daily basis, so most of the phone contacts are messages. We have been listed in the phone book in the church section, so at least half of the messages or more left on our phone have been from individuals seeking financial assistance. I've been tempted to phone them back and ask for their help.



We are continuing to ask God for 10-15 more churches to consider prayer and financial support. We presently have 5 churches that have partnered with us. If you would continue to pray and give as God directs, that would be a great encouragement.

In addition to prayer, there is something that you might consider doing to help us. Would you tell one Christian friend about our ministry? If you need more information, urge that friend to contact us or direct them to our web site. You might also ask the appropriate leader at your home church if they are aware of Eagle Summit and the purpose of our ministry. There is a great opportunity to partner with smaller churches in rural communities to not only encourage a Pastor and his fam-



ily, but to also develop an ongoing relationship with an entire community.

Have we overlooked the "Judea" in our own backyard? There are mission fields only hours away where teens and adults from larger churches could effectively communicate the Gospel in rural communities through VBS programs, teen outreach and special community events. There is no necessity of learning another language or understanding another culture Establishing a continuing relationship would be extremely beneficial for all. Consider this prayerfully.

The Three Challenges of Serving God's Servants

"Feed me. Feed me." The frustrations can seem endless, but the blessings of fulfilling the calling in one's life are eternal. There is no more satisfying place to be than in the bull's eye of God's will. Keep in mind, that "bull's eye" represents a target and the enemy will continue to take his best shots at us.
