There was concern over some serious undercarriage corrosion issues that we were told would be problematic. Because of the generosity of one of our supporting churches and another donor, we have now opened a savings account and we have a good down payment toward a newer vehicle when we locate just the right one.

A few weeks ago, I was allowing the enemy to cause me to dwell on a number of negatives involving family issues, finances, health and ministry. At the moment, it was overwhelming. I opened

the mail that day to find another generous gift toward the van. After a time of reflection, tears and gratitude I simply thanked the Lord for this encouragement. It was a reminder from God, at just the right moment, that He is in control. To each donor, we "Thank You" for being sensitive to God's direction.

After the latest servicing of our current 1993 Chevy van, we also learned that the engine problem that was first diagnosed does not appear to be as serious as originally thought. We will monitor the engine issue and continue to carefully maintain the van, but for now all appears to be well with the engine so we will NOT be facing a major repair. Continue to pray with us for God's clear direction. We will be putting a lot of miles on the van in ministry travel this summer. When possible, we are also using our personal vehicle to minimize expenses. The great thing about the van is that when I am holding a camp or VBS, I can travel with all the extras I need to make the most impact.

I remember hearing that still, small voice when I was four or five. My Mom would always send us to Sunday school but not attend herself. I can remember odd things like being put in a pew during church with people I did not know. I remember observing communion from underneath the plate that was passed over

my head. One time I was given a piece of something that was red and tasted like red licorice. There was the time in Sunday school that everyone was told to bow their heads for prayer. I didn't know what prayer was so I looked! I was given a very stern look and even at five knew embarrassment. I had no memory of ever hearing the name Jesus or who this Jesus was. I did understand the sting of knowing when I'd done something wrong. I had quite a journey to Christ.

My bout with heart disease, at the age of nine, caused me to wonder what life was about. I became terrified of dying. I attended a Bible school at about the age of eleven. I made a plaque with the name of "Jeasus" written on it. I did not even know how to spell His name correctly. I knew I wanted to know who God was and wanted a relationship with Him; I just didn't know how to get to Him. I would lie in bed at night listening to my heart beat.

I woke up one morning to the sound of a siren and flashing lights. My friend's father had died of a massive heart attack. The terror in my heart overcame me. My great aunt was a nun who had spent her whole life in a convent. I thought if I made the sign of a cross it would "get me close to God." It didn't work. When I was fourteen a friend invited me to a youth activity. Praise God for youth workers in church! After the fun came the message. The youth pastor simply told us all that we were sinners and that our sin separated us from God. Even at the age of fourteen I knew I was a sinner. The pastor showed me from the Bible that Christ died for my sins. He simply read God's words to me and finally, I found the answer I was seeking. I asked God to forgive me and invited Christ to become a part of my life. I went straight home that night and told my dad what had happened. He said, "That's nice, it'll go away." I was crushed, but did not give up. I did not know how to pray, but I asked God to show me where I should go to church. Within the week I had an answer.

I've come a long way since then. Matthew 19:14 "Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belong to such as these." Who are you to the children in your life? Do they "catch you praying?" Do they see your love of God's word? The Holy Spirit may be working on the inside, what impression are you making on the outside?
