We have spent the past six weeks visiting a number of supporting churches here in the Spokane area and as far north as Kettle Falls. These churches who have a heart for others have


been a vital part of our ministry TEAM. Some are able to support us regularly on a


I am constantly reminded of what a privilege that we as mere human beings can be part of the plan of our Creator. Help us continue to "Serve God's Servants."


