I Didn't Cry Yesterday

Just over six months ago, we received a phone call any parent would dread. It was from the medical staff at St. Joseph's Hospital in Bellingham, WA who informed us of the serious vehicle collision that resulted in the death of our youngest son, Benjamin. During the past six months, we have had very few days without tears. There are constant reminders, often when we least expect it. I was driving today and a semi pulled along side. It was a "Benjamin Moore" Company vehicle. My thoughts raced to the accident scene involving a semi truck and the fact that I wanted to see our *Benjamin* one *more* time.



What makes one laugh or cry reveals a lot about a person's character and values. Frustration, disappointment, loss and separation often result in tears. Tears can make others feel uncomfortable, but true friendship can tolerate and even encourage tears. God does understand our tears. God invented tears. He made us to cry. Tears wash the heart.

The certainty of heaven and our ultimate reunion does not negate the fact and pain of separation. We have learned to drive and cry. We have learned to laugh and cry. We have learned to cry alone and in silence. We have learned to cry quietly at church. We have learned to expect tears. In fact, a day without tears has been unusual. I realized today that I did not cry yesterday.

I am reminded that Jesus wept. Were His tears over the loss of a friend or the unbelief of those closest to Him? The truth is that it was probably for both reasons that Jesus shed tears. In His humanness, He understood the loss and separation that death brings. He also was disappointed with those who loved Him the most, but still did not understand Who He really was and the power over death that was in His touch or in just a word. Psalm 40:1-5

- 1 I waited patiently for the LORD; he turned to me and heard my cry.
- He lifted me out of the slimy pit, out of the mud and mire; he set my feet on a rock and gave me a firm place to stand.
- He put a new song in my mouth, a hymn of praise to our God. Many will see and fear and put their trust in the LORD.
- 4 Blessed is the man who makes the LORD his trust, who does not look to the proud, to those who turn aside to false gods.
- Many, O LORD my God, are the wonders you have done. The things you planned for us no one can recount to you; were I to speak and tell of them, they would be too many to declare.

Randy and Sue, Betty, Vicki, Viola, Bill and Paula, Clay and Jewel, Uncle Ken and others close to our ministry who are living through the death of one close to the soul, be encouraged in the Lord with the fact that God sees and hears our tears. He is aware of our grief. Our tears are not wasted, but are part of cleansing of the soul. God's way, the only way . . . pray and cry and cry and pray. It's okay. It's God's way. We are looking forward with increased anticipation to the day when He will wipe away all tears.
