# Thoughts from Diane . . . NIGHT

When I was nine, our family moved to Medicine Lake, near Minneapolis, Minnesota. I loved it there and I enjoyed the friendships I had in the neighborhood. The house we moved to was just a small cabin and it was an old one at that! Back then I never thought about inconveniences such as space. We had all we could want when we walked out the door. What kid wouldn't want a lake in their back yard? We even had a dock and boat. None of it was "safety rated" and I could tell you stories about how I came close to death a time or two. There were few safety regulations and that was all the better for a child's imagination.



One thing I didn't like was the dark. My big brother Robert was twelve, two and a half years my senior. Mom and dad were out one night and left my brother Robert in charge. I remember sitting in the living room alone. It was a beautiful summer evening and I thought I heard a noise outside. There was this scratching sound coming from the window. It sounded like someone was scrapping across the screen. I remember sitting there in sheer terror. I was certain



someone was trying to get into the house and that I was a sitting duck. I know I started to cry and I have no idea how long it was before my mom and dad came back. I was so thankful when they finally made it home. They found me in tears and then found my brother Robert. I believe he thought (as any good brother would) that it was great entertainment to see how he could frighten his little sister.

God speaks about the darkness in Romans 13:11-14. "Besides this you know the time that the hour has come for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed. The night is far gone; the day is at hand. So then let us cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light. Let us walk properly as in the daytime . . . but put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires."

It's time for us to stop acting like childish Christians. So many of us have had time to grow up through a deeper understanding of the Word of God yet we choose to indulge in desires that don't honor God. We speak of our anticipation to see Jesus and yet we dishonor His name by the choices we make while we're still on this earth. It's time for us "to cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light." We have a job to do. We have good news to share. We need to be prepared. If we don't gain an understanding of what God expects of us, we will never be able to stand against the works of darkness. Stay in the Word because in knowing God we gain firm ground upon which to
