Classes are designed for those already engaged in full time vocational ministry or employed lay leaders.



Unexpected Van Repairs Here's an Opportunity to Pray and Give

Summer presents its challenges for many ministries. Along with family vacations, giving to faith-based ministries often takes a vacation as well. So this is the perfect time for vehicle repairs, not that there is a perfect time. Our mechanic found the source of an ongoing problem which required lifting the van off its frame. The estimate was \$2,000. The actual cost was \$1,271.27. We are grateful that the cost was less than estimated, but we did not have that amount set aside. We were able to purchase tires recently, replace the steering box and maintain fuel and maintenance costs, but we did not have this added amount set aside.

Our mechanic is frustrated as well. As he stated, this vehicle has less than 40,000 miles on it. It's like a new van. We should not be having the repair issues we are having. I actually did contact Ford with our concerns, but that was a dead end. One would think there would be concern over the steering box going out. Loss of control on the freeway could prove to be problematic. No, there was no concern. The Ford folks I spoke with seemed to think that was normal wear. That's not normal in my book. I also learned that they stopped manufacturing this particular vehicle. Hum, I wonder why?

In addition to the current repairs, Ford has announced a hose connection problem in the cooling system. Our mechanic relayed to us that this connection could explode at any time. Ford has not even made the parts necessary for repair as yet. They should be available in the next few weeks. This is not a recall issue, so we will be required to pay the estimated additional \$550 to correct this problem. Our Van Fund has a negative balance. We have a faithful friend who has given monthly to keep our van maintained and fueled, but the need is beyond that.


It would be great to cover the current expenses and have a bit of a cushion in our Van Fund. We are asking the Lord for \$2,500 in gifts to pay for these repairs and have a small amount in savings for the unexpected. 


