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STRIVING TO SERVE GOD'S SERVANTS

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Why We Serve through Eagle Summit

In a recent conversation with a ministry partner, I was challenged to remember the motivation of my call to serve through Eagle Summit. I was also challenged to rethink why anyone should consider partnering with us through prayer and financial support. In 1994, I was encouraged to consider what would be my "dream ministry." In the previous nearly twenty-five years of ministry, I had never taken time to "dream." There was always to much to do, too many to serve and not enough hours in a week. I allowed myself to "dream."

Over the next two years, God made it clear that the previous years of ministry were but preparation for what was to come. During that time, I learned of four pastors who took their own lives. I attended Bible college with one of those pastors. The question God impressed on my heart and mind was, "Who do pastors talk to?" I began to consider what a privilege it would be to have the freedom to serve pastors of small and rural churches. To serve as a roving assistant pastor would be fantastic.

That dream blossomed into reality and in the fall of 1996, Eagle Summit Ministry was born. As ESM grew, I realized that pastors, especially in rural settings, face unique challenges. These include but are not limited to being required to be a "jack of all trades," on call 24/7, often in debt because of low income, living in a fish bowl with his wife and children criticized, not enough time to study and prepare and no one with whom to share



burdens or concerns. The pastor is just supposed to talk to the Lord. The challenges can seem overwhelming with no way out. Pastors need friends, accountability and prayer partners. Our heart is to help meet this need through ESM.

I was also challenged to consider why our ministry is part-time, why after over twenty years, we are not at this full time. I have had several encourage me to get involved with sales opportunities that would provide total support for ESM. I have refused that direction. If God's people are not prompted to support this ministry, than it is not to be. I am in no way equating myself with the apostle Paul, but he too always had a second job as a tentmaker so as not to be a burden to others. Along with gifts from God's people, he worked hard. God has always opened doors for part-time employment that allowed me time for ministry as well. In addition, many of the pastors we serve are bi-vocational, so I can understand some of their unique challenges from that perspective. Diane has also worked to help provide for our home and make ministry possible. She drove school bus here in Spokane Valley for twenty-seven years. Without her faithful partnership, encouragement and love for the Lord, Eagle Summit would never have flown.

I was reminded of the worldwide Gospel impact of small and rural churches. One mission organization surveyed missionaries on the field and learned that nearly 75% of came from churches having an attendance of 100 or less. One church we serve informed me that over the years, fourteen young people came to know the Lord through our ministry. Some of them may be reaching the unreached with the Gospel in the future. As long as God gives health and strength, we will continue to serve. Your partnership through prayer and financial support are our encouragement. For that, we are most grateful.

Thoughts from Diane . . . Erroneous Thinking and Belief

We had our air ducts cleaned just over a year ago. George decided the time was right because I was attempting to clean one of the vents and had a debilitating asthma attack. I really didn't give it much thought in advance of that although George did and as things go in our homes, it got placed on a back burner. At one point the owner of the company came by. He knew about my health and asked me if I'd ever considered seeing a hypnotist. He told me he had one he'd seen and by being hypnotized he'd overcome depression. I shared my faith in Jesus first and then told him in all my reading of God's Word, I'd never seen anything that would indicate I needed a hypnotist to heal me. I was kind but firm about my complete faith in Christ.

My pet's go to a groomer that has become a good friend over time. She told me her husband had kidney disease and he had been seeing a Shaman and had great success in getting victory over the disease. She said the Shaman would be in town to see her husband soon and she knew he would be more than happy to see me. My groomer is a wonderful person and very kind. I listened to everything she said and had to tell her that my faith is in Jesus. Our conversation wasn't long but over time I have had opportunity to share my faith with her more.

I have a very sweet friend who talks about her faith. Unfortunately her faith is based on experience and not much on God's Word. Her oldest son died just over a year ago. She's been online with long dissertations about her devastation and rage. In one breath she says she trust's God in another she using vile language with anger against people she's said were responsible for her son's death. In another post she'll talk about dreams/visions of seeing her son and she begs him to come back. She had a large moth that hung in her garage for three days and she truly believed that moth was her son reminding her he was alright and was watching out for her. I've spoken to her before about her experiences and that they were not in line with God's Word. However, she continues in her delusion. I speak the truth to her in love. I'm acquainted with her devastation.

The Apostles spent years teaching the body of Christ the truth about who Jesus is and what He wants us to know. Reading this beloved book called the Bible is the most valuable way to spend your time. I'm speaking of the Old and New Testament. You might say "I have a really hard time reading," or "I don't understand what it means."
